Clinical Methods In Paediatrics History** Past medical history. The scope and detail of this part of the history are determined by the nature and severity of the presenting complaint as well as the child's age. For example, if a young child presents with delayed speech, a detailed birth and neonatal history, as well as details of developmental milestones, would be required. Medical ...

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The suggested aims of the paediatric history are to: Direct appropriate examination and investigation. Reach a correct diagnosis (or form a differential diagnosis). Establish the context of a child's illness (psychological, family and social context).

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Clinical Knowledge Summaries - CKS (Add filter) Depending on the child's age, take a history from both the child and the family/carer to identify: Red flags which may indicate serious disease.

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The approach to the examination will be determined by the age, level of development and level of understanding of the child. Inspection and observation are the most important parts of the examination. Observations can be made whilst taking the history and establishing rapport.
